Master of Education in Educational Program Design

Total Required Credits: 30

Core Coursework (4 Courses/12 Credits)

Summer – Year 1

Core Courses are offered as one-week intensives

EDPD 604 Designing 21st Century Learning Environments (3 Credits)
Come away with an understanding of the unique challenges and opportunities technology brings to the design of learning environments.

EDPD 601 Assessment Design + Evaluation (3 Credits)
Design a range of varied formative + summative assessment instruments to complement the requirements of your school or District and to reflect your own instructional style and align with student learning outcomes.

Summer – Year 2

Core Courses are offered as one-week intensives

EDPD 602 Curriculum Design (3 Credits)
Explore and develop models of curricula aligned with local, state, and national standards. Work through strategies for interdisciplinary teaching, constructivist learning environments and integrative curriculum modules.

EDPD 603 Instructional Design (3 Credits)
Examine teaching and learning as a delivery system, with focus on: instructional design for specific populations, how technology impacts instruction, and the relationship between curriculum, instruction and assessment.

Elective Coursework (4 Courses/12 Credits)

Accelerated Track

Complete MEd in 2-3 years

- 9 credits completed within selected Area of Emphasis (**Arts, Literacy, Inclusion, Educational Technology**)
- 3 credits from any Area of Emphasis
- Electives are completed during Fall + Spring between Summer semesters of Core Coursework
- MEd is completed in 2-3 years

Summer Core Track

Complete MEd in 5 years

- 9 credits completed from within selected Area of Emphasis (**Arts, Literacy, Inclusion, Educational Technology**)
- 3 credits from any Area of Emphasis
- Electives are completed in Summer semesters
- MEd is completed in 5 years

Culminating Coursework (2 Courses/6 Credits)

Fall – Final Year

Hybrid course - coursework is completed both in-person and online.

EDPD 605 Research Methods (3 Credits)
Explore various research design paradigms and the assumptions behind them, including the use of the literature, development of research questions, qualitative and quantitative approaches, and research study formats. Improve the practice of research while developing a better understanding of it.

Spring – Final Year

Hybrid course - coursework is completed both in-person and online.

EDPD 701 Capstone Project (3 Credits)
Bring together the sum of MEd coursework through choice of Capstone Project: curriculum project, research project, or action research project. Strong focus on how findings can be used to support classroom, school and District-level change.

Master of Education in Educational Technology

Total Required Credits: 30

Core Coursework (4 Courses/12 Credits)

Summer – Year 1

Core Courses are offered as one-week intensives

EDPD 604 Designing 21st Century Learning Environments (3 Credits)
Come away with an understanding of the unique challenges and opportunities technology brings to the design of learning environments.

ETEC 601 Integrating Educational Technology Into Student Assessment (3 Credits)
Successfully identify and facilitate the integration of effective educational technology into the classroom to assess student achievement.

Summer – Year 2

Core Courses are offered as one-week intensives

ETEC 602 Differentiated Instruction Using Educational Technology (3 Credits)
Examine and test the vast range of digital tools, resources and applications and the relationship to today's learner.

ETEC 603 Ethics In Educational Technology (3 Credits)
Build understanding of learning environments that imbue a K-12 classroom ethos and sensibility within a tech-rich world.

Elective Coursework (4 Courses/12 Credits)

Accelerated Track

Complete MEd in 2-3 years

- 12 credits completed within Area of Emphasis: **Educational Technology**
- Electives are completed during Fall + Spring semesters between Summer semesters of Core Coursework
- MEd is completed in 2-3 years

Summer Core Track

Complete MEd in 5 years

- 12 credits completed from within Area of Emphasis: **Educational Technology**
- Electives are completed in Summer semesters
- MEd is completed in 5 years

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
